I can offer a little helpful information about the year gone by. The recent accident on the Alpine Plateau Road should serve as an important reminder to be diligently defensive driving — especially when snow is on the road. You never know what's around the corner!

Many have been asking about billing issues concerning the AIA assessment. Change is always cumbersome. This change has been going on for a long time. Appfolio is the preferred billing and payment collection of our management company. Billings are sent via email unless you personally make other arrangements. Mailing statements is an additional expense to the Association. Payments are received (from most) automatically. Since the whole thing is automated you need to handle the unbilled transactions differently. The computer does not know what you are doing if you pay amounts not billed. You cannot just add trash fees, parking plug-in fees, MCH pack fees, or any other fee or payment to your bill and expect the computer to properly credit the payment. So here is information on how to handle these...You should pay any extra fee by:

In the MEMO SECTION you MUST indicate your ARROWHEAD STREET ADDRESS, and what the dollar \$ amount is for (i.e. Trash, Parking, Fines, etc.). This will get the payment properly credited.



2. Alternatively, it is possible to contact Assurance HOA Mgmt. (970) 787-6060, IN ADVANCE to add a specific amount for a specific charge to your quarterly assessments. This will educate the computer. Reoccurring fees (like trash) could be equalized over the whole year.

3. If you really think computers should be smarter, you can go ahead and pay any amount you want, but I will warn you that the computer will apply it all to what it billed you, totally confusing you and our management people. Use your words! Tell them what you are trying to do if it is not the ordinary assessment. — or just practice 1. or 2. above!

Enough of the past for a moment.

I lift a glass to your joy and happiness through Christmas and throughout the coming year.





The maintenance crew has been hard at work the past few weeks, getting our equipment ready for winter. They had all of our equipment in pretty good shape until a logging truck ran into the grader.

Fortunately, no one was hurt in the accident, but it did extensive damage to our grader and the logging truck. The grader will be out of commission for a while. We are still able to plow the Alpine Plateau Rd., but it takes a little longer and snow can't be pushed as far off the road.

Please be patient when traveling up and down the Alpine!! Watch for vehicles pulling snow mobile trailers and especially logging trucks. A lot of these logging trucks are going too fast for the conditions, they are taking their share of the road and they cannot stop a loaded log truck on a dime. Please be careful and TAKE IT SLOW!!



Our Winter Parking Lot opened on October 15th and there are already plenty of vehicles parked there. **Please observe the orange cones that mark the rows.** The front of your vehicle should be lined up with the cones. When leaving the mountain for over two days, please park your snowmobile or UTV up on the hill, don't leave it in the parking lot.

To park a trailer in the parking lot for the winter, the charge is still \$50.00, and to use a diesel parking spot the charge is \$265.00 for the season. We also have diesel parking for the weekend or the week--- **Contact patrol at: 970-209-6335.**



AIA Winter Parking Lot

- Opens October 15th and closes on May 31st. (CLOSED during the Summer months)
- All vehicles must be registered with Patrol and display a yellow Arrowhead sticker guest pass. This includes cars, trucks, trailers, snowmobiles, and UTVs.
- Parking is limited to the areas indicated in GREEN
- Property owners are permitted on highway vehicles in the main parking area only.





- Individual cars and trucks are to park in the main area, aligning with the orange cones. Do not extend the south end of the vehicle past the line designated by the cones.
- Snowmobiles are to park above the berm on the west side of the parking lot.
- Tracked UTVs (Geezer&mobiles) are to park between the signs, located on the NW corner hillside.
- Box trailers are to be parked on the West hillside.
 See below Required Fee Schedule or contact Patrol
- Flatbed trailers are parked in the NW corner of the main parking area. See below Required Fee Schedule or contact Patrol
- Weekend truck and trailer parking is in the NE corner of the parking lot. (No fee but a time limit is imposed.
- Limited electrical hook-ups are available on a firstcome-first-serve basis. See below Required Fee Schedule or contact Patrol

No Parking Areas

- East side of the main area next to the large berm.
- Behind the box trailers.

Other Dos and Don'ts

- Do not leave your snowmobiles or UTV vehicles in the regular parking areas if you will be off the mountain for more than 2 days (48 hrs).
- You must be here to remove your vehicle when maintenance is plowing the lot. If you cannot remove your vehicle, you must make arrangements with a neighbor or patrol for help.
- · Never chain snowmobiles together.

When the **FILING ROADS are CLOSED** for the winter season, the Arrowhead Improvements Association wants to remind all owners, residents, and their guest, to please stay on ALL GROOMED filing roads and marked snowmobile trails within the Association's subdivision. "Boondocking," "shortcutting" and/or "widening" of the filing roads are all considered off trail riding, which is a violation of the *AIA Regulations and a criminal trespass under state law. Off trail riding that results in property damage carries higher penalties.

*AIA Regulations - Article 7, section 2, subsections (E) & (F) and Colorado Revised Statutes - Criminal Code, section 18-4-504.





Message from Patrol 🌞

I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving holiday with your family and friends Christmas is just over the horizon with many people making plans for a fun holiday season. In those plans many will be traveling. Please travel safe and be sure to watch the forecasted weather and carry the needed items in case of an emergency.



This year, Patrol has run into a bit of a dilemma with trailer parking at the Winter Parking Lot. We have asked that Patrol be contacted BEFORE you park your trailers and that we meet you before parking. It has been difficult to keep the parking organized and this year has created a challenge to find enough parking. People are moving cones to park where it is not allowed which create more problems for parking lot clearing. Plus, we have trailers parked with no stickers so we can't identify the owners.

So, I am asking the residents to <u>please</u> help us next year in the trailer parking process. Please <u>do not</u> start parking your trailers when the parking lot opens without first calling patrol and make arrangements to meet at lot. We will make sure your trailer is properly ID'd and if not we will issue an Arrowhead sticker. We will collect your fifty dollars and give you a receipt and will tag the trailer to show it is paid rather than sending the money to the HOA. It will help patrol have better control of who has paid. If you have any questions, please call us for any clarification or help.



Also, a reminder of winter parking rules (see page 5 for more information). If you're leaving for more than two days, please park your UTV or snowmobile on the hill rather than leaving it in a parking space. As everyone knows, parking spaces are at a premium. On another note, if you're leaving a vehicle for long periods of time and not moving it to clear snow, please have someone be available to move your vehicle from the parking lot when we have to plow the lot of snow. This year, we will impose \$\$\$ fines if vehicles are not moved out in a timely manner when the parking lot needs to be cleared. Depending on Mother Nature, we do give the community a 48 to 72- hour notice when the Maintenance Crew plans to plow the parking lot. Check back to our AIA Facebook page and/or AIA website for notices to be posted. One last item, when parking the UTV's on the hill, please line up machines so there is at least 20 feet in front and in back of UTV so that the groomer can groom between them. Also, try to park back up to the trees and start spacing. This is all new to a lot of people and Patrol would appreciate your help.

If you have any questions or doubts, please call Patrol 970-209-6335 and we will be glad to help you. If you're a new owner and would like an orientation about Arrowhead, please call us and set a time to get together.

Also, Patrol is still looking for qualified candidates to join our team. An application can be found on the Arrowhead website or contact Patrol or Brad Fowler for more details.

Important Winter 2022 Information

Arrowhead Patrol will NOT "run" driveways (breaking trail) upon request this coming winter, as it has done in the past. The practice of "running driveways" began over 15 years ago as a "service" to the *Arrowhead Volunteer Fire Department (AVFD)*, at a time when the AVFD did not possess tracked vehicles for emergency use during the winter season. The AVFD now operates their own appropriate winter equipment.

Over the years, this non-mandated and unbudgeted service has resulted in injuries to our Patrol staff, Workers Compensation Insurance liability and additional wear and tear to AIA Equipment. The AIA Board of Directors decision to immediately cease this service is made with the safety of AIA employees and a reduction of liability in mind.

Marking your driveway and filing a <u>Waiver of Liability form</u> will still be of value to emergency responders and Patrol. Continue to contact Patrol to inspect and tag your driveway. The form may be found here: https://www.arrowhead1.org/_files/ugd/673d36_ea36cc1b9fb14c908b1682fb5c108e56.pdf





The snow came early this year and has been off and on since. This was a very productive year with over 50 projects being completed. Now things calm down on the mountain for a bit. The Design Review Committee had our final meeting of the year in October. Our first meeting in 2023 will be March 13th. We will meet at the lodge at 9am. If you are wanting to start a project next summer, you don't need to wait until we meet in the spring to start planning. You can get a jump on your plans by submitting everything to my email @ ithompsonaia.drc@gmail.com and I will have you on the agenda for the March 13th meeting. This way, we can help you get everything in place so the site visit can be conducted once the snow melts and you can begin your project.

Please remember the planned construction in the canyon will still be going on for at least part of Summer 2023. This led to many difficulties, frustrations, and delays this summer with getting supplies up to Arrowhead as well as easy access from Montrose and Gunnison. Be sure you talk with your contractors about how this will impact your plans. The committee thanks you for educating yourself on the rules and <u>regulations</u> of our amazing community. With that being said, a couple of reminders:

When you are planning a property improvement, you need to have the <u>Construction Agreement</u> and <u>Plot Plan</u> sent to me (jthompsonaia.drc@gmail.com) and the \$100 permit fee needs to be mailed to

- Send all building plans with the Plot Plan and Construction Agreement to jthompsonaia.drc@gmail.com
- You need to locate your center pin and flag several points on the property boundary.
- Flag several points of the adjacent properties as well.
- Flag any site of improvements -- driveway, shed perimeter, trees you think need removed, etc.
- Once this is done contact a Joanie Thompson(<u>ithompsonaia.drc@gmail.com</u>) and I or a committee member will schedule a time for a site visit.
- Please refer to this document for many of the different project types done in Arrowhead.
- Here is the link to the Design Review Committee website where you can find the regulations and more information.
- DRC members are happy to assist you in this process but as the property owner you are responsible for the accuracy of the center pin. A professional site survey is the best way to be positive of an accurate center pin, if it is in question.

** <u>Utilities</u> ** Many owners have been asking about putting in utilities. Please note that this **MUST** be approved by the Design Review Committee. You are not required to pay for a permit, but we must approve the location of your plans. Failure to notify the Design Review Committee could result in up to \$500 in fines.

**Shed Regulations ** -

- All Sheds MUST be approved by the Arrowhead Design Review Committee. <u>Click here for the process.</u>
- If you have an approved Gunnison Co septic system, you do not need a Gunnison Co building permit as long as your shed is no larger than 200sf. If the shed is larger than 200sf you are required to apply for a building permit through Gunnison Co.
- If you do not have an approved Gunnison Co septic system, you are required to get a building permit from Gunnison Co. no matter what the size.

Please know that **all** property improvements need to go through the DRC. Most require a permit. Failure to notify the Design Review Committee could result in up to \$1000 in fines. Some plans just get the go ahead "OK" because they are considered maintenance. It is better to ask than be in violation of the <u>Arrowhead Regulations</u>. We have a lot of new contractors up here and they do not know our Regulations. It is the homeowner who is responsible for educating themselves and their contractors about the rules. If your contractor doesn't ask if you have gone through the Design Review Committee for approval, they are most likely not familiar with our rules and regulations.

Please continue to follow the requirements set forth for improvements in the <u>2020 AIA Regulations</u>. This helps the committee move forward for you more quickly. If your project requires a Gunnison County Permit, please click here to access their website.

We look forward to continuing to serve the owners' of this great community. Have a fantastic Holiday Season. Hopefully we will be getting the snowmobiles out on the trails soon.


All meetings are held at the firehouse unless the filing roads are closed. If roads are closed, the meeting will be held at the Arrowhead Mountain Lodge lobby.

Forestry Message

The Arrowhead Forest is beginning to look like a winter wonderland. Some say this is the best time of year at Arrowhead and I would say they are right. This time of year the forest goes into hibernation. I am hopeful that the winter will be full of snow and less of the major wind that caused all the blowdown we had last year.



The winter is here with all its glory, and that means it is MCH order season. The bark beetles that habitat the trees in the summer are hibernating in the bark and waiting for spring to spread again. Our best defense against these harmful insects at Arrowhead is MCH packs. MCH packs are made as a defense for the Douglas Fir and Spruce bark beetles.

Price for the MCH packs will be listed on the website once they come out. When you are ready to order packs, Send your check payable to: **Arrowhead Improvements Association, Inc.**

Also, please send me an email to arrowheadforestmanager@gmail.com when the check is sent and tell me how many packs you need. The MCH packs will be available for pickup in May and will need to be put up during the first part of June for best defense. If you are not going to be available to put them up during this time, you can have the Arrowhead Volunteer Fire Department put them up by making a donation of your choice. Please write a separate check to the Arrowhead Volunteer Fire Department (AFVD) and send it to me at 1495 Spruce Road, Cimarron, CO, 81220.

As for those suffering from the major Spruce Bud Worm problem. The Ace Caps are available to buy as well. Ace Caps will kill the worms before they eat the needles of the tree. 3/8" caps can be used in trees under 20" in diameter with caps placed every 6 inches around the base of the tree. ½" caps can be used on trees greater than 20" in diameter with caps placed every 8 inches around the base of the tree. Price for listed quantities: \$56.25 for 75 of 3/8". \$45.00 for 50 of ½". Please send a **SEPARATE** check for the Ace Caps order to **Arrowhead Improvements Association** and mail it **c/o Assurance HOA Management, 2121 Market Street, Montrose, CO 81401.** In the **MEMO SECTION you MUST indicate Ace Caps and your ARROWHEAD STREET ADDRESS** Again, please send me an email message to tell me how many caps you need.



During the Winter months, the filing roads in Arrowhead are CLOSED to all vehicular traffic except for snowmobiles and other tracked vehicles.



Lakes & Fishing: There are three (3) lakes available to AIA property owners and their stocking of the Lower Flint Lakes and has set a catch limit of three (3) fish per person guests: Flint Lakes, Evergreen Lake and Hazel Lake. Winter storms can happen almost anywhere. They can cause us problems. Know what to do before, during and after a storm. This will help keep you and your family safe from a winter fire.

- Test all smoke alarms. Do this at least once a month.
 This way you will know they are working. Install carbon monoxide alarms in your home. Test the alarms.
- Plan two ways out of the home in case of an emergency.
 Clear driveway and front walk of ice and snow. This will provide easy access to your home.
- Make sure your house number can be seen from the street. If you need help, firefighters will be able to find you.
- Be ready in case the power goes out. Have flashlights on hand. Also have battery-powered lighting and fresh batteries. Never use candles.
- Stay aware of winter weather. Listen to the television or radio for updates. Watch for bulletins online.
- Check on neighbors. Check on others who may need help.
- Generators should be used outdoors. Keep them away from windows and doors. Do not run a generator inside your garage, even if the door is open.
- Stay away from downed wires. Report any downed wires to authorities.
- Be ready if the heat stops working. Use extra layers
 of clothes and blankets to stay warm. If you use an
 emergency heat source, keep anything that can burn
 at least 3 feet away.
- Turn portable heaters off when you leave the room.
 Turn them off when you go to bed.


